A benefit will be held for Hance Hope on Saturday, May 7, 2005, noon to 5 p.m. at the Baxter Springs High School.

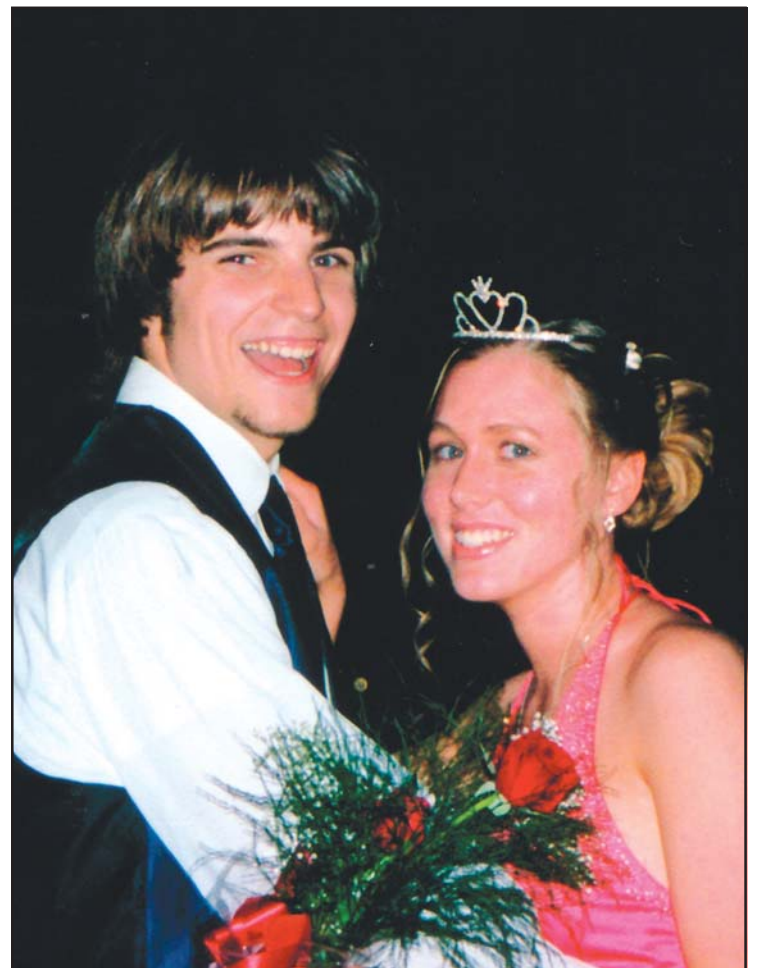
"Solid Gold" will perform from 1-4 p.m. Area Bike and Car Clubs are invited.
