## City Council enjoys new sound system

Something new has been added, and much appreciated, in the Council room at City Hall. A new sound system, purchased with money from the sale of Old Route 66 bricks, has been installed and was in use for the first time at the regular council meeting on Monday, June 6. Mayor Myra Frazier presided with all members present.

Mostly routine business was transacted. The Council approved the following:

a. Vacating the alley between Euclid and Moeller, 12th and 13th Sts., as requested by residents.

b. Purchase of water meters for present use and for reserve.

c. Payment of mandated physical exams for CDL license applicants. This item was not passed by unanimous vote.

d. Hiring of part time dispatchers to be called in when

necessary in lieu of excessive overtime hours.

e. Set lifeguard salaries at \$7.00 per hour.

f. Approved repair of steps leading up to Nature Center where the mortar is gone.

g. Considered drainage problems at two locations, between 8th and 9th on Elm and 17th and Joplin.

h. Gave permission for the Missouri Fur Company to camp on top of the hill near the Nature Center on June 25 and 26 as requested by Linda Phipps.

i. Heard from Richard Pendleton, Metropolitan Engineering Co., concerning final plans for the grant funded Main Street project. His report was to be considered in an executive session along with personnel issues.

j. Approved the appointment of Randy Youngblood as assistant city superintendent.

## Missouri Fur Company to camp at Schermerhorn Park in Galena

The Missouri Fur Company, which will be camping on top of the hill near the Nature Center, Schermerhorn Park, on June 25 and 26, consists of a group of people who do 1840's period living history re-enactment rendezvous.

Sturday, June 25, will be Visitors Day, allowing area residents to visit the camp and learn about the life of trappers and fur traders of the 1800's.

There will be demonstrations of primitive bow shoot-

ing, black powder shooting (no real ammunition will be used) hawk and knife throwing, Dutch oven cooking and much more.

Also on that day Dr. Cindy Ford, PSU, will be on hand to demonstrate the use of natural dyes, spinning and weaving.

And to top off the occasion, Larry Anderson of Galena will discuss his extensive Native American artifact collection which is on display at the Nature Center.
