Joplin's Salvation Army is active in hurricane relief

The Salvation Army at 320 East 8th Street, Joplin, has a Disaster Team ready to go to the Gulf Coast whenever they get the call from their headquarters. However, at the present time, the Southern Territory has informed the Army here that they are in need of money donations more than anything else due to the fact the states nearby are sending in food and water and they do not have the means to store everything in the hot, humid weather.

The Joplin Army is on standby, Captain Shelli Cunningham told the Sentinel, except for money donations which are forwarded immediately. Checks or cash should be earmarked "Hurricane Katrina" and can be brought to the Joplin office at 320 E. 8th St., Joplin, or mailed to P.O. Box 1362, Joplin, Mo., 64802. Payment can also be made online at www.salvationarmyusa.org.

Mark Jones, public relations director for the The Salvation Army in Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi, had this to say: "Financial contributions

allow The Salvation Army to reinvest in affected areas by purchasing supplies from vendors close to storm ravaged areas."

Medical and first aid supplies are being accepted now, as are food items and water. However, these items will go into trucks which are standing by for the orders to go south.

Clothing, bedding, and furniture cannot be handled in the stricken area at this time. These items will be sent at a later time when the anticipated need will be great.

The Salvation Army was the first relief organization on the scene in Biloxi, Miss., and national headquarters has sent emergency disaster services vehicles (canteens) into all of the stricken area, providing food and drinks as well as emotional and spiritual support to residents, evacuees and first responders.

Several thousand meals are being served daily by the Salvation Army in the coastal area and will continue as long as the need is there.
